<p>As AUTHORS we will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Continue to develop our handwriting and presentation. • Write topic related texts: Diary recount; Explanation text; Persuasive writing; Instructional writing • Plan, write and edit our own evacuee story. 	<p>Enquiry Question:</p> <p>What was it like for children during World War 2?</p>	<p>As SCIENTISTS we will be focusing on Forces – gravity, friction, air and water resistance. Learning will be topic linked where possible.</p>
<p>As READERS we will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Read ‘Letters From The Lighthouse’ by Emma Carroll, as well as classic and modern topic related texts, and stories from other cultures. • Read non-fiction books about WW2. • Use class guided reading to develop comprehension and inference skills. • Incorporate time for independent reading (silent and aloud), encouraging a wide range of texts and new vocabulary. 	<p>As GEOGRAPHERS and HISTORIANS we will be using our topic to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn about the reasons for, and the timeline of the war, including key wartime figures. • Locate Allies and Axis countries involved in the war. • Investigate key targets of the Battle of Britain and the Blitz; where and why. • Investigate a local wartime incident (Petworth bombing). 	<p>In addition, we will be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Computing: Looking at internet safety and coding. • R.E: Chinese New Year, Holi, Judaism - Passover & Holocaust, Lent & Easter. • P.E.: Daily Mile, Gymnastics, Forest School, Yoga, Swimming & Dance • Art & DT: Propaganda Art, Shadow Art, Holi, Ration cooking (nutrition & seasonality) • Languages: Spanish • PSHCE: Refugees – WW2 and now.
