In P.E we did movements of different animals like a lion and an elephant; we have also been doing symmetrical and Asymmetrical shapes with our P.E teacher Joe. For D.T we are researching Warburtons history and how bread is made, we taste tested 6 different breads and recorded our findings.

I am writing to you from Reaching Families to let you know about the services that we can offer to parents and carers.

Who are Reaching Families?

Reaching Families is a parent-carer led charity that supports parents and families of children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities in West Sussex. We do this through a number of services including the delivery of information, training and peer support. We have recently increased our training delivery and support groups and have a wide range of free workshops, courses and groups that some of your families may find helpful. I have attached our current flyers but I wanted to let you know about our Umbrellas parent/carer support group in Shoreham.

What is Umbrellas?

Support from fellow parent-carers is one of the most effective ways in which parents and carers of children with special educational needs and disabilities build resilience and emotional wellbeing. Parents also tell us their most valuable source of information, support and advice is other parent-carers.

To help parents build networks of mutual support we currently run seven parent support groups in Shoreham, Burgess Hill, Horsham, Littlehampton, Chichester, Worthing, and online via Zoom. Known as Umbrellas, our groups provide an informative, supportive, relaxed and non-judgmental environment within which parents can swap life experiences, share hints and tips, seek advice and share information and resources.

Today I told another story that shows we can be friends with somebody who is different from us. Naomi came from a country called Judah. As there was no food in Naomi's country, she and her husband and two sons went to live in a foreign country called Moab. It was very different in Moab. There was food,

but the people worshipped different gods, so it was strange. Very sadly Naomi's husband died. Her two sons married two girls from Moab. One called Orpah, the other called Ruth. Very sadly again, her two sons died as well. So, of the little family which left Judah, just Naomi was left. Naomi decided to go back home to Judah. She told her son's wives, 'Stay in your home country, Moab, where you might get married again. Orpah did. But Ruth wouldn't leave Naomi. She said, 'I'm coming with you Naomi'.

Ruth told Naomi, Where you go, I will go And where you stay, I will stay. Your people will be my people And your God my God. Ruth 1.16

It was very generous and kind of Ruth to do this. Ruth and Naomi were really different people. Ruth was young. Naomi was old. Ruth came from Moab. Naomi came from Judah. Ruth worshipped different gods to Naomi. But Ruth still went to Naomi's country with her, and looked after her there, and worshipped the same God as Naomi. They became friends. And because of their friendship, very good things happened. One day, Ruth would become the great granny of King David!

We said a little rhyme, as if we were Naomi.

'Ruth is my best friend, my best friend, my best friend Ruth is my best friend, she's always there for me!' And then we said it again using the name of our own best friend, and finally using Jesus' name, who is a friend for us all.
