

KS2 French Curriculum Overview

This document outlines the **KS2 French curriculum**, ensuring a smooth progression across **Year 3**, **Year 4** and **Year 5/6**. Each term includes one or two topics per year group, carefully designed to develop key language skills in **listening**, **speaking**, **reading and writing** while fostering a love for language learning.

The teaching approach is based on **Rosenshine's Principles of Instruction**, ensuring lessons are structured to maximise learning and retention. This includes:

- **Regular review** of key vocabulary such as numbers, colours, days of the week, months of the year and phonics to reinforce prior learning.
- Introducing new material in small steps, ensuring pupils build confidence before progressing.
- Using questioning techniques to check understanding and encourage active engagement.
- Providing clear models and scaffolds, such as sentence structures and speaking frames, to support learning.
- Guided and independent practice, allowing pupils to apply their learning in structured and creative ways.
- Regular review of topics to strengthen long-term retention of language structures and cultural knowledge.

In every lesson, children will **reinforce core vocabulary**, ensuring strong foundations in essential language skills. Additionally, throughout the year, we will explore **French culture and traditions**, learning about **important celebrations** such as **Mardi Gras, Easter, Bastille Day and Christmas**. This cultural awareness enhances students' understanding of how language is used in real-world contexts and deepens their appreciation of the Francophone world.

This curriculum provides a **strong foundation** in French, equipping students with the vocabulary, grammar and cultural knowledge they need for a smooth transition into **KS3 language learning**.
