#### **Chichester Food Bank!**

On Thursday 20th March, Year 6 went to Chichester Food Bank to take all the tins down we collected from our tins challenge and to learn about how our donations make a difference to people's lives. At the warehouse, we saw that there were volunteers

from the public helping to sort the food and other supplies into packages that will be sent out to the community in need. We were told that the amount of food/items in the warehouse weighed the average of a baby elephant, and that was only two weeks' supply!

The food bank sends out lunchboxes for families and children in need during the holidays, and in those packages they have enough food to last for ten days. Some of the items were, breakfast and lunch. Each lunchbox weighs around 12 kilos.
