# **Reverend Vivien writes:**

We began our infant assembly in church by lighting the candle and singing 'I've got peace like a river, I've got love like an ocean, I've got joy like a fountain in my soul' which we had sung last week. I spoke about the school's five Christian values, responsibility, friendship, respect, hope, kindness, and extra value of forgiveness, which we think about in turn each week, and which the children now know really well. What great people we would all be if we all showed these values all the time to each other and offered forgiveness when it is needed. I asked are you doing this? Yes! Are the teachers doing this? Yes! Am I doing this? Yes, with the help of God - because I think of God as the one who helps us to be good people and church a good place to come for this.

This week is Hope week. I reminded the children Christian hope does not mean hoping something good might happen. Christian hope means being confident and trusting that something good is going to happen, which is that Jesus will always there to help us. This week's story from the bible is about Jesus stilling the storm. We had rivers and oceans and fountains in the song we sang. Now we have a storm on a lake. Jesus is on the lake in a boat with his disciples, sleeping on a cushion, and there's a great storm and they are frightened the boat will capsize. They wake Jesus who stands up and stays to the lake, 'Peace, be still' and it is stilled.



Every story about Jesus has a special meaning. This story is saying first, Jesus is amazing and second, when something scary happens to us, Jesus helps calm the scary thing down and make it better. Christian hope means trusting no matter what scary things may happen Jesus helps bring peace, and love, and joy back into our hearts and souls. We repeated the song we sang at the beginning with a new verse I made up, 'I've got hope like a harbour in my soul'. Then we said a prayer and our blessings.


## A HUGE THANK YOU....
